Spin in Washington, D.C.

Launched in November 2018, with a permit extending to the end of 2020

Fleet cap of 720 scooters, with requirement to serve the entire city

Hours of operation: 24 hours/day

Cost to riders: \$1 unlock / \$0.29 per

minute



Spin Safe in the time of COVID-19



Out in the field, Manwel D., Operations Specialist in Washington, DC, is taking extra care to make sure all major points of contact have been thoroughly sanitized.



Operations Guidelines

- Developed in accordance with CDC guidelines and best practices
- Each scooter that enters the warehouse is cleaned with disinfectant wipes or disinfectant spray and a clean towel at all major points of contact handlebars and mast before it can be repaired or charged
- We take similarly rigorous precautions with our scooter delivery vehicles...
 - Van cab surfaces must be fully disinfected after each shift
 - The steering wheel, shifter, upper door panel, blinker switch, center console radio and air conditioner knobs should be cleaned between shifts or whenever a driver is changed

Rider Guidelines

- Essential Rides: Be sure to follow local government and public health orders when riding.
- Wear a Cloth Mask at all Times: Wear a cloth mask whenever you go out in public and ride Spin.
- Ride Solo: For safety purposes and for social distancing recommendations, maintain six feet of distance between yourself and others.
- Wash Your Hands Before and After Riding: As a precautionary measure, wash or sanitize your hands before and after each ride. Gloves can also be worn as an additional preventative measure.
